Calligrams

A **calligram** is a <u>poem</u>, phrase, or word in which the <u>typeface</u>, <u>calligraphy</u> or <u>handwriting</u> is arranged in a way that creates a visual image. The image created by the words expresses visually what the word, or words, say. In a poem, it manifests visually the theme presented by the text of the poem.
