


#### How to Play:

- There are two teams: blue and purple.
- The **purple** team starts by choosing a letter. They will click on a letter and a question will appear. If they answer the question correctly, the hexagon will turn purple. If they answer incorrectly, the question is passed to the **blue** team. If the **blue** team are able to answer the question correctly, the hexagon will turn blue. If neither team are able to answer the question, the hexagon remains white. The hexagon will change colour when you click outside of the letter. Teams take it in turn to choose any hexagon and answer the question. For the hexagons to change, click on the chosen hexagon until it is the right colour. The order is purple, blue and then white.
- You can play alone. Pick a route through the board and see if you can make it all the way without getting a question wrong.

The first team to cross the board with connecting hexagons is the winner.



The eggs were delivered by Clive.


My bike was found by a friendly neighbour.

Yesterday, I ate three different types of donuts a jam one, a custard one and a plain one.


For our camping trip, I need to pack some vital equipment my tent, a sleeping bag, a gas stove and a water carrier.
