- a) Flimsy- insubstantial and easily damaged.
- b) mph (This is an acronym; each letter stands for a different word.) Miles per Hour- the number of miles a vehicle travels in one hour.
- c) Launched- send (a satellite or spacecraft) on its course.
- d) Engineers- a person who designs, builds or maintains engines, machines or structures.
- e) Satellite- an artificial body placed in orbit round the earth or moon or another planet in order to collect information or for communication.
- f) Orbit- a curved path of a spacecraft round a star, planet, or moon.
