Someone made a mistake trying to make chewy sweets and it turned into a non-chewy substance.

Invention	How it happened
Doughnut Holes	An 11-year-old boy called Frank Epperson left a drink with a stirring stick outside over-night and because it was so cold the drink froze.
Ice Cream Cones	A man named Spencer Silver was trying to make a strong glue and ended up making a very weak glue that could stick to things but could easily be lifted off.
Bricks	The story began in China where Cinderella wore slippers made of fur. It was translated to French and the word vair (meaning fur) was confused with verre (meaning glass).
Cinderella's Glass Slipper	A sea captain Gregory needed to steer his ship with both hands so put his fired cake on the ships wheel making holes in the middle.
Ice Lolly	Bonnano Pisano built a bell tower in Pisa on soft soil and the foundations were not strong enough to hold the tower up.
Post-it Notes	Mud and silt from a riverbed were deposited onto the bank and when it dried it was found to be very strong. It could also be cut into different shapes.
Leaning Tower of Pisa	The shop seller ran out of dishes to serve the dessert in so he quickly rolled a waffle into a cone shape and served the dessert in this.
