Simple sentences An independent clause. Contains a subject noun and a verb.

Scott plays football.

Complex sentences

An independent clause with one or more dependent clauses (which do not make sense alone).

Joined together by a subordinating conjunction (subordinate clause) or a relative pronoun (relative clause).

Scott plays football because he enjoys it.

<mark>Scott</mark>, <mark>who</mark> enjoys</mark> most sports, <mark>plays</mark> football.

Compound sentences Two independent clauses. Joined together by a co-ordinating conjunction or a semi-colon. Scott plays football and he's very talented. Scott plays football, he's very talented.
