- ✓ 'To' – this version shows your intentions to do something. E.g. I am going to the shops. I am going to wash my hair this evening.
- ✓ 'Too' – this version is for when there is too much of something. E.g. you are too loud! That was too quick for me. It can also mean 'as well as'. E.g. I have those trainers too! Can I come to Alton Towers too please?
- ✓ 'Two' – this is the number 2. E.g. I have two boiled eggs for dinner. Did you see the two birds flying across the sky?

Now it's your turn. Write these sentences with the correct version of 'to'.

1. I am going **to** have my dinner at a friend's house tonight.
2. I have eaten way **too** much food and I think I might need **to** have a lie down.
3. I saw **two** ghosts last night, although I could have been dreaming.
