Examples: Sammy <u>jumped</u> over the fence. Lucy was <u>running</u> the race.

What are adverbs?

Definition: adverbs describe verbs.

Examples: He ate his breakfast <u>quickly.</u>
Abby was typing <u>slowly.</u>
Nervously, David crept to the closed door.

Test: Can you use an adverb in a sentence?
Can you tell me what the adverbs are in the sentences that I just used?

How, Where and When?

Verbs are: running, dancing and hopping

Example



How: Enthusiastically
When: Early in the morning
Where: inside the classroom.

Sentence: Early in the morning, the three children were

singing enthusiastically inside the classroom.
