- 1. Why did Betty look up in alarm when she heard the prison bell clang?

- 2. How do you think the girls feel about living close to a prison? Find evidence in the text to support your answer. - 3. Who do you think they are waiting for? How are they feeling about their visitor coming? This is your own opinion so your answers will be different.
- 4. What impression does the author give you about what the pub is like inside? Find some key words in the text to help your answer (clue, you looked at some of them in your vocabulary lesson!) The author gives us the impression that the pub is quite run down and old. I know this because the author uses words such as shabbiness, threadbare carpets and peeling wallpaper.
