This week you are going to use and develop your inference skills. Inference is using the information and evidence to help answer questions.

How do you know this?

3. Was Kyle's report card good or bad and why was it like that?

How do you know this?

He probably got bad grades.
Ex: He balls up his report card and hides it.

2. He is trying to dispose of the evidence. He doesn't want anyone to know. **Ex:** He goes through great lengths to conceal the report card. He seems to feel better after it is disposed of in this particular fashion.

3. Kyle's report card was probably bad because he plays too many video games.

Ex: I know this because in the text he plays video games for six hours and sleeps with his feet on his book bag. He is not even opening the book bag.
