Step 1: What is a Clause?



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A clause is a group of words that make up a sentence. They contain a **verb** (an action) and a **noun** (person, place or object). **For example**

The dog played dog is the noun played is the verb

Clauses can also have other words such as **adjectives**, adverbs and more than one noun. For example

The angry dog played aggressively with the ball angry is the **adjective** because it describes the dog aggressively is the **adverb** because it describes how the dog played ball is another **noun** because it is the object that is being played with.



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There are different types of clauses. We are going to look at **main clauses**. A main clause is a sentence that makes sense on it's own. For example

The angry dog played aggressively with the ball.

Today you are going to look at finding verbs and nouns in main clauses. You will also need to put punctuation in the correct places to make the clause correct.
